

# Free Classic Crochet Bunny Pattern



## Pattern Description:

A soft, vintage-inspired floppy-eared bunny, crocheted with basic stitches and simple shaping. The design creates a cuddly, squishy stuffed toy perfect for Easter, baby gifts, or everyday snuggles.

The pattern is beginner-friendly, adaptable to different yarns, and works up into a charming keepsake about 10 inches tall.

## Materials Needed & Measurements:

- **Yarn:** Lion Brand Homespun (or similar)
- **Yarn Weight:** Super Bulky (6)
- **Hook:** 8.0 mm (US L)
- **Notions:** Stitch markers, yarn needle, fiberfill stuffing, scissors
- **Measurements:** Approximately 10 inches tall when finished

## Abbreviations Used

- ch - chain
- sc - single crochet
- inc - increase (2 sc in same stitch)
- dec - decrease (single crochet 2 stitches together)
- sl st - slip stitch
- st(s) - stitch(es)

## Instructions for Making the Classic Crochet Bunny Pattern:

### Getting Started

Before you begin, gather your supplies: super bulky yarn, an 8.0 mm (US L) crochet hook, fiberfill stuffing, a yarn needle, and scissors.

Use a stitch marker to mark the beginning of each round since you'll be working in continuous spirals. The bunny consists of the following pieces: head, body, arms, legs, ears, and tail. Each part is worked separately and then joined at the end.

### Making the Head

- Start with a **magic ring** and work 6 single crochets (sc) into the ring. Pull tight.
- Round 2: Increase in every stitch around (12 sc).
- Round 3: 1 sc, inc- repeat around (18 sc).
- Round 4: 2 sc, inc- repeat around (24 sc).
- Round 5: 3 sc, inc- repeat around (30 sc).
- Rounds 6-10: Work even, 1 sc in each stitch (30 sc per round). This forms the rounded head.
- Begin decreasing: 3 sc, dec- repeat around (24 sc).
- Next round: 2 sc, dec- repeat (18 sc).
- Begin stuffing the head firmly with fiberfill.
- Continue: 1 sc, dec- repeat (12 sc).
- Final round: dec around (6 sc). Fasten off and sew the opening closed.

### Making the Body

- Start with a magic ring, 6 sc inside.
- Round 2: Increase in each stitch (12 sc).
- Round 3: 1 sc, inc- repeat (18 sc).
- Round 4: 2 sc, inc- repeat (24 sc).
- Round 5: 3 sc, inc- repeat (30 sc).
- Rounds 6-12: Work even (30 sc per round). This forms the round belly.
- Begin tapering: 3 sc, dec- repeat (24 sc).
- Next round: 2 sc, dec- repeat (18 sc).
- Stuff body firmly with fiberfill.
- Continue: 1 sc, dec- repeat (12 sc).
- Final round: dec around (6 sc). Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing to the head.

### **Making the Arms (Make 2)**

- Start with magic ring, 6 sc inside.
- Round 2: Increase in each stitch (12 sc).
- Rounds 3-7: Work even (12 sc per round).
- Round 8: 1 sc, dec- repeat (8 sc).
- Lightly stuff arms (not too full to keep them floppy).
- Flatten opening and sew closed. Leave tail for attaching.

### **Making the Legs (Make 2)**

- Magic ring with 6 sc.
- Round 2: Increase in each stitch (12 sc).
- Round 3: 1 sc, inc- repeat (18 sc).
- Rounds 4-8: Work even (18 sc per round).
- Round 9: 2 sc, dec- repeat (12 sc).
- Lightly stuff, then sew opening closed. Leave tail for attaching.

### **Making the Ears (Make 2)**

- Chain 6.
- Row 1: Work 1 sc in second chain from hook, then sc across. Turn.
- Row 2-8: Continue in rows of single crochet, slightly decreasing at edges to taper.

- The ear should be long, soft, and floppy. Make a second one to match.

### **Making the Tail**

- Magic ring, 6 sc inside.
- Round 2: Increase in each stitch (12 sc).
- Round 3: Work even (12 sc).
- Round 4: Dec around (6 sc).
- Stuff lightly and close off. This forms a small round puff tail.

### **Assembly**

- Sew the head to the body using the long tail from the body piece. Ensure it sits firmly.
- Attach arms to either side of the body just below the head.
- Sew the legs onto the base of the body so the bunny can sit.
- Attach the ears symmetrically to the top of the head. They should hang down loosely for the floppy look.
- Sew the tail at the back of the body.
- Optionally embroider eyes, nose, and mouth using black or pink yarn.

### **Finishing Touches**

Check that all parts are securely fastened, especially if the toy will be given to children. Shape the bunny by gently molding the stuffed sections. The end result is a plump, floppy, and huggable bunny ready to be gifted or cherished as a keepsake.
