

# Treble Scallop Edge



- **Yarn Used:** Scheepjes Stone Washed – DK (Category 3)
  - **Fiber Content:** 78% Cotton, 22% Acrylic
  - **Colorway:** Moonstone (801), or your preferred shade
- **Estimated Yardage:**
  - For a baby blanket edge (30–36” width): approx. **25–50 yds**
  - For a full shawl or throw: **75–100 yds**, depending on size
- **Recommended Hook:** 3.5 mm (US E/4)
- **Finished Measurements:**
  - Each scallop measures approx. **2.5" (6.5 cm) wide** and **1.5" (4 cm) tall**.
  - The pattern is worked across a stitch multiple of **6 + 1** (e.g., 19, 25, 31, etc.).
  - You can adapt it to fit **any length of edging** as long as you maintain the stitch multiple.

## Stitches and Abbreviations (US Terms):

- **ch** – chain
- **sc** – single crochet
- **dc** – double crochet

- **tr** – treble crochet (yo twice, insert hook, yo and pull through 2 loops three times)
- **sl st** – slip stitch
- **sk** – skip
- **st(s)** – stitch(es)
- **rep** – repeat

## Stitching Instructions for Making the Treble Scallop Edge Pattern:

### Foundation Row (Attach & Prep):



- Join yarn with **sl st** anywhere along the edge. Ch 1, and **sc evenly** across the edge, working 1 sc per stitch/row end. Make sure your final st count is a **multiple of 6 + 1**. Turn.
- **Row 1 (Setup Row):** Ch 1. **Sc in each st across**. This row gives a stable base for the scallops. Turn.
- **Row 2 (Scallop Row):** Ch 1, **sc in first st**, sk next 2 sts, work (**tr, dc, tr, dc, tr**) in next st (this is the scallop), sk next 2 sts, **sc in next st**; rep from across the row. You should end with a final **sc in last st**. Fasten off and weave in ends.



## Finishing Instructions:



- **Block your work** if desired light steam blocking or wet blocking will help the scallops lay flat and open beautifully.
- **Weave in all yarn tails** with a tapestry needle.
- If created separately, **attach using whip stitch** along the edge, matching up the scallops with consistent spacing.

## Tips & Variations:

- For **smaller scallops**, swap all **tr** for **dc**.
- For **larger scallops**, increase the number of **treble crochets** to 5 or more per fan.
- To add lace detail, insert **ch 1** **between each tr/dc** within the fan.
- Try using a **contrasting yarn color** for bold effect, or a **gradient yarn** for elegant transitions.
