

Tulip Blanket Trim



Materials Needed:

- **Suggested Yarn:** Scheepjes Stone Washed (DK) or equivalent DK yarn
- **Yarn Measurements:** Approximately 200-300 yards (depending on the size of your blanket)
- **Gauge:** Approx. 18-20 sc per 4 inches (adjust based on yarn used)
- **Hook Size:** 3.5mm (E) hook
- **Finished Pattern Size:** This will vary based on the size of your blanket and how many tulip motifs you wish to create.
- **Other Tools:**
 - Darning needle
 - Scissors
 - Stitch marker (optional)

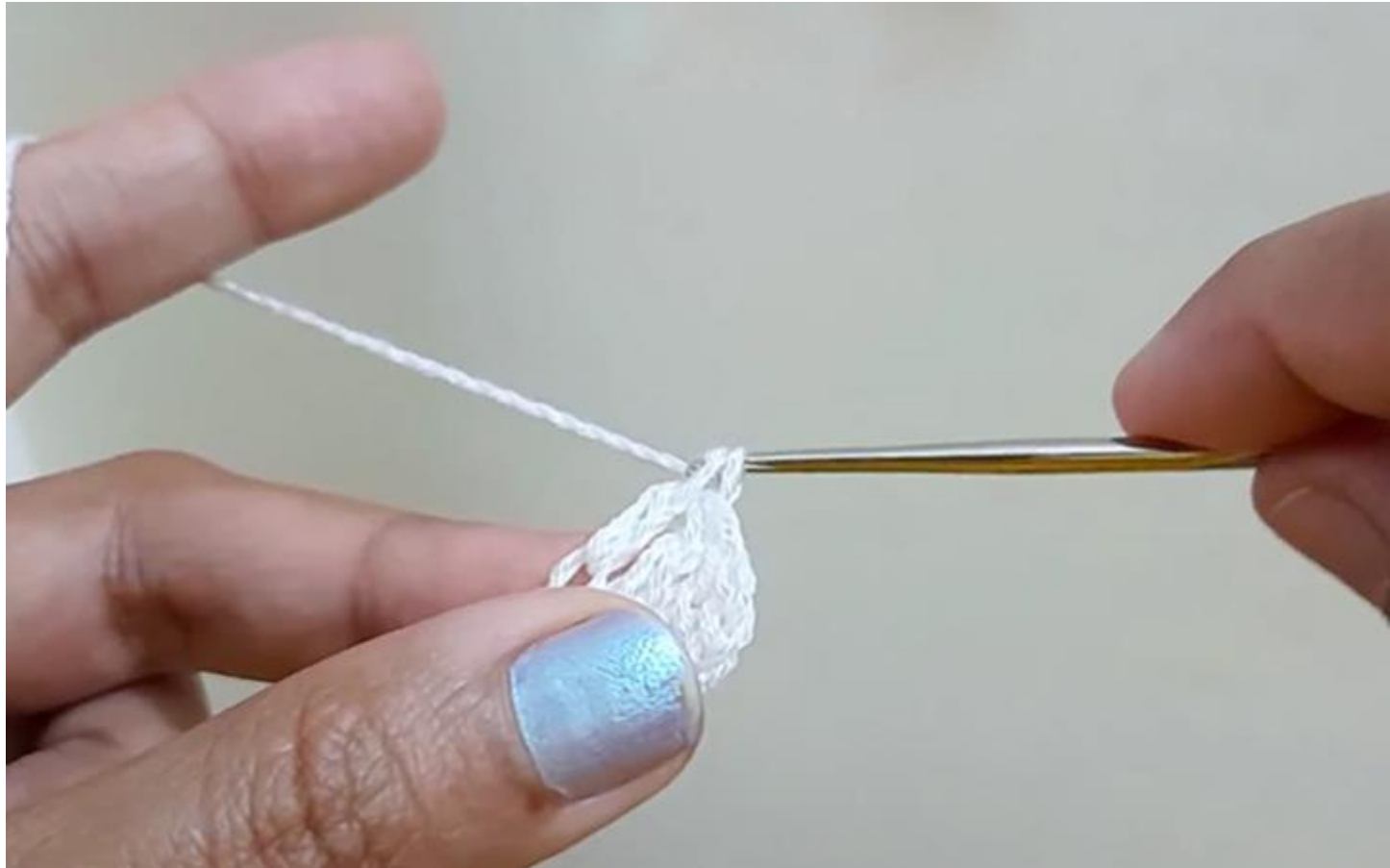
Abbreviations Used:

- **sc** - Single Crochet
- **dc** - Double Crochet

- **ch** - Chain
- **sl st** - Slip Stitch
- **st(s)** - Stitch(es)

Stitching Instructions for the Tulip Blanket Trim:

Row 1:



- Start by attaching the yarn to the edge of your blanket. You can do this by slip stitching into any corner or along the side.
- Chain 1 (this counts as your first sc).
- Work sc evenly across the edge of the blanket, making sure the number of sc stitches is even, so your tulips will be evenly spaced.

Tulip Motif:



- **Starting the Tulip:**
 - In the next stitch, chain 3 (this counts as the first dc).
 - In the same stitch, work 2 more dc (making a cluster of 3 dc in total).
 - Turn your work, ch 2, and work 3 dc in the next space (this creates the petal shape).
 - Repeat the same process to form the remaining petals of the tulip.
- **Creating the Tulip:**
 - Chain 5 (this will form the stem of your tulip).
 - Join with a sl st into the next space on your blanket's edge.
 - Repeat this tulip motif across the edge of your blanket, keeping the tulips evenly spaced.

Row 2:



- After completing the tulip trim around the entire blanket, fasten off the yarn and weave in the ends securely using a darning needle.
- For the final row, you can add an optional border by working 1 sc in each stitch across the edges, adding a delicate finishing touch to your blanket.

Finishing:



- Once you've completed the tulip motifs, trim any loose yarn ends and secure them.
- If desired, add additional rows of sc or dc stitches along the edge to make the trim fuller or more textured.
- Weave in all remaining ends carefully using a darning needle.
