Shaped Washcloth



Skill Level: Easy+

Pattern Summary:

This round washcloth features a beautiful, petal-like shape that's worked seamlessly in the round.

The textured design is achieved with strategic increases and skipped stitches using basic crochet techniques.

It's a quick and satisfying project-perfect for gifting or adding charm to your own kitchen or bath.

Finished Size:

• **Diameter:** Approximately 9 in. (23 cm)

• Gauge: Not critical for this project

Materials Needed:

Yarn: Lion Brand[®] Kitchen Cotton[®]

o Color: Tropic Breeze (#831)

Weight: Medium (4)Content: 100% Cotton

o Ball Size: 2.00 oz (57 g), 99 yd (90 m)

Hook: Size J-10 (6 mm)

• Notions: Large-eye blunt needle for weaving in ends

Abbreviations (US Terms):

- beg begin(ning)
- ch chain
- ch-sp chain space
- **dc** double crochet
- rep repeat
- rnd round
- **sc** single crochet
- **sk** skip
- sl st slip stitch
- st(s) stitch(es)


Notes:

- Do not turn your work at the end of rounds.
- The beginning **ch 3** counts as a **dc** throughout the pattern.
- Use the adjustable ring method to start: wrap yarn around finger, insert hook into loop, yarn over, pull up a loop, and proceed to work stitches into the ring. Pull tail to close.


Stitching Instructions for Making the Shaped Washcloth Pattern:

Start with an adjustable ring.

Rnd 1:



- Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc into the ring, ch 1. (2 dc in ring, ch 1) repeat 5 times. Join with sl st to top of beg ch-3. [12 dc, 6 ch-1 sps]
- Rnd 2:




- SI st in each st to reach the first ch-1 space. In the first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc). In each remaining ch-1 sp: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc). Join with sI st in top of beg ch. [24 dc, 6 ch-1 sps]
- Rnd 3:




- SI st to the first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc. In each ch-1 sp: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc. Repeat around. Join with sI st to top of beg ch.
- Rnd 4:




- SI st to first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next **2 dc**, sk **2 dc**, dc in next **2 dc**. Repeat (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in each ch-1 sp with the same dc pattern between. Join with sI st in top of beg ch.
- Rnd 5:




- SI st to first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next 3 dc, sk 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc. Repeat around. Join with sI st to top of beg ch.
- Rnd 6:



- SI st to first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next 4 dc, sk 2 dc, dc in next 4 dc. Repeat pattern around. Join with sI st.
- Rnd 7:




- SI st to first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sI st, ch 3, dc, ch 1, 2 dc), dc in next **5 dc**, **sk 2 dc**, dc in next **5 dc**. Repeat around. Join with sI st to top of beg ch.
- Rnd 8 (Final Round Border):



• Sl st to first ch-1 sp. In first ch-1 sp: (sl st, ch 1, 3 sc). sc in next 6 dc, sk 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc. Repeat (3 sc in ch-1 sp, sc in next 6 dc, sk 2 dc, sc in next 6 dc) around. Join with sl st in first sc.

Finishing



Fasten off and weave in ends using a blunt needle.
