Free Baby James Blanket Pattern



Pattern Description:

The Crochet Baby James Blanket is a striped baby blanket. It primarily utilizes the **Herringbone Half Double Crochet (HHDC)** stitch, which creates a desirable flat, no-hole fabric.

The pattern incorporates color changes every two rows and is finished with a distinct border.

Materials Needed & Measurements:

- Yarn: Bernat Bundle Up (100% Polyester, 140 g/4.9 oz, 244 m/267 yds)
 - o Colors/Quantities: 1 ball each of Dove and Sky Blue, 2 balls of Marshmallow.
- Yarn Weight: #4 worsted, medium.
- Hook: Size I, 5.5 mm crochet hook.
- **Notions:** Scissors, tapestry needle.
- Measurements: Approximately 30 x 33 inches.

Stitches & Abbreviations Used:

- Herringbone Half Double Crochet (HHDC): YO, insert your hook, YO, pull up a loop and pull directly through first loop on hook, YO and pull through remaining two loops.
- **Single Crochet (SC):** Insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through two loops on hook.

- **CH:** Chain.
- SL ST: Slip Stitch.
- YO: Yarn Over.

Instructions for Making the Baby James Blanket Pattern:



Follow these steps for making the Baby James Blanket:

Main Blanket Pattern:

To begin, you will start with the **Dove (gray) yarn**.

- Starting Chain: Chain 105, or chain any number to achieve your desired width.
- Row 1 (Starting with Dove):
 - o Begin by working into the **third chain from the hook**.
 - Work one HHDC into each chain across the row.
 - o At the end of the row, **CH 2 and turn**. You should have 103 stitches.
- Row 2 (Continuing with Dove):
 - o Begin by working into the first stitch.
 - o Work one HHDC into each stitch across the row.
 - o At the end of the row, CH 2 and turn.
- Repeat Rows with Dove:
 - Repeat the instructions for Row 2 for the next 2 rows. This means you will have a total
 of 4 rows worked in Dove yarn.
 - At the end of the 4th row, on the very last step of the final stitch, change color to Sky
 Blue by pulling the new color through to complete the stitch.

CH 2 and turn.

Color Change Sequence for Blanket Body:

- Rows 5 and 6: Work these two rows using **Sky Blue**, repeating the instructions for Row 2.
- Rows 7 and 8: Work these two rows using Marshmallow, repeating the instructions for Row 2.
- Going forward, you will change color every two rows in this specific order: Dove, then Sky Blue, then Marshmallow.
- **Tip:** To minimize the number of ends you need to weave in, **carry the yarn up the side of the blanket** when changing colors.

Finishing the Main Blanket Body:

- Continue working the striped pattern until your blanket measures approximately 30 inches long.
- For the final section of the blanket, work the last 4 rows in Dove yarn.
- Once the blanket reaches the desired length and the final Dove rows are complete, tie off your yarn and weave in all remaining ends.

Border Pattern (Using Marshmallow Yarn):



After completing the main blanket, you will add a three-round border using Marshmallow yarn.

- Round 1 (with Marshmallow):
 - Work **one HHDC into each stitch** along the top and bottom edges.
 - At the end of each row (meaning at the corners of the blanket), work a corner sequence of [HHDC, CH 1, HHDC].

- Work one HHDC at the end of each row along the side edges of the blanket.
- o **Join with a SL ST to the first HHDC** you made in the round.
- CH 1, and do not turn.

Round 2:

- Work one SC into each stitch around the blanket.
- o At each corner, work a corner sequence of [SC, CH 1, SC].
- Join to the first SC of the round.
- CH 1, and do not turn.

• Round 3:

- o Work one HHDC into each stitch around the blanket.
- At each corner, work a corner sequence of [HHDC, CH 1, HHDC].
- o **Join** to the first HHDC of the round.
- o CH 1, do not turn.

Repeating Border Rounds:

- Repeat Rounds 2 and 3 a total of two more times. This means your border will consist of Round 1 (HHDC), Round 2 (SC), Round 3 (HHDC), then repeat (SC, HHDC) twice more, for a total of six rounds in the border.
- Finishing the Border:
 - o At the end of Round 6, tie off your yarn and weave in all the remaining ends.

This completes the Crochet Baby James Blanket pattern, allowing you to create a cozy and beautiful blanket.
