# Free Castal Colorwork Scarf Pattern



# **Pattern Description:**

This easy skill level crochet pattern creates a colorwork scarf worked lengthwise in one piece.

It features a combination of single crochet (sc) and treble crochet (tr) stitches, alternating between front loop only (flo) and back loop only (blo) techniques, with **fringe attached to the ends** for finishing.

# **Materials Needed & Measurements:**

- Yarn:
  - o LION BRAND® HOMETOWN™ (Art. #600)
  - o #108 Washington Denim Celestial Stripes: 3 balls
  - o #302 Aspen Tweed: 2 balls
- Hook: Crochet hook size M-13 (9 mm)
- Notions:
  - Lion Brand<sup>®</sup> large-eyed blunt needle
  - Additional material for fringe: strands of yarn A and B, about 8 in. (20.5 cm) long for each fringe
- Measurements: About 6 1/2 x 70 in. (16.5 x 178 cm)

# **Stitches & Abbreviations Used:**

- **ch** = chain
- rep = repeat
- **sc** = single crochet
- st(s) = stitch(es)
- **tr** = treble
- **flo** = Front Loop Only
- **blo** = Back Loop Only

# **Instructions for Making the Castal Colorwork Scarf Pattern:**

## **Scarf Construction**

The scarf is worked lengthwise, starting with a foundation chain.

## Beginning the Scarf:

 With Yarn A (Washington Denim Celestial Stripes), chain (ch) 176. This forms your starting foundation.

## Row 1 (Right side):

- Work one single crochet (sc) into the second chain from your hook.
- o Continue to work **one sc in each chain stitch across** the entire row.
- At the end of this row, you will have 175 sc.

#### Row 2:

- o Chain (ch) 1, then turn your work.
- Working in Front Loop Only (flo), work one sc in each stitch across the row.

#### • Row 3:

- o Chain (ch) 1, then turn your work.
- o Working in Back Loop Only (blo), work one sc in each stitch across the row.

#### Change to Yarn B:

o After completing Row 3, change to Yarn B (Aspen Tweed).

#### • Row 4:

- o With Yarn B, chain (ch) 4. This chain of 4 stitches counts as your first treble (tr) stitch.
- Turn your work.
- Working in Front Loop Only (flo), work one tr in each stitch across the row.

#### Change to Yarn A:

Once Row 4 is finished, change back to Yarn A.

#### • Row 5:

- With Yarn A, chain (ch) 1.
- Working in both loops (standard crochet), work one sc in each stitch across the row.
- Turn your work.

# Repeating the Pattern:

- o To continue building the scarf, repeat Rows 2-5.
- After completing this sequence of repeats, repeat Rows 2 and 3 once more.

#### Last Row:

- The final row of the scarf is a **repeat of Row 2**.
- Once this last row is completed, **fasten off** your yarn.

# **Finishing**

After the scarf body is crocheted, the next step is to add the fringe and weave in any loose ends.

#### • Preparing Fringe:

- For each individual fringe, you will need to cut 1 strand of Yarn A and 1 strand of Yarn
  B, with each strand measuring approximately 8 inches (20.5 cm) long.
- o Hold these two strands together and fold them in half.

## • Attaching Fringe:

- Using your crochet hook, draw the folded loop of the fringe strands through the end of the Scarf.
- Once the loop is through, pull the loose ends of the fringe through this loop.
- o **Pull firmly to tighten** the fringe securely to the scarf.

## • Placement and Trimming:

- o You will make 20 fringes on each end of the Scarf.
- Ensure the fringes are spaced evenly along both ends.
- o After all fringes are attached, **trim the ends of the fringe evenly** to create a neat finish.
- Final Touches: Finally, weave in any remaining loose ends using your large-eyed blunt needle.
