# Grandma Cuddles Baby Blanket Pattern



## **Pattern Description:**

The Crochet Grandma Cuddles Baby Blanket is **fun to make and easy to crochet**. It features a **fun texture on one side and a flat texture on the other**.

The border is finished with a **nice-looking Half Double Crochet (HDC) ribbed technique**, resulting in a **modern, giftable, cuddly blanket**.

#### **Materials Needed & Measurements:**

- Yarn: Bernat Bundle Up yarn is highly recommended.
- Yarn Weight: Any 4-weight yarn can be substituted for similar size results.
- **Hook:** A **5 mm hook** is required.
- Notions: You will need scissors, a tapestry needle, and a stitch marker.
- Measurements: The finished blanket measures 34 x 34 inches.
  - Gauge: The gauge taken from the blanket is 4 inches = 10 stitches (sts) and 10 rows.

#### **Stitches & Abbreviations Used:**

• **SC**: Single Crochet

• **HDC**: Half Double Crochet

• TC: Treble Crochet

• **CH**: Chain

• **SL ST:** Slip Stitch

#### Instructions for Making the Grandma Cuddles Baby Blanket Pattern:

#### **Main Blanket Pattern Instructions**

The body of the blanket is created by repeating a sequence of rows to build its unique texture.

- **Starting Chain:** Begin by chaining **112 stitches**. It's noted that any even number can be chained if you wish to adjust the size of the blanket.
- Row 1: In the second chain from the hook, work 1 SC. Then, TC into the next chain, followed by SC into the next chain. Repeat from \* across the row, ensuring your last stitch is an SC. After completing the row, CH 1 and turn. This row will have 111 stitches.
- Row 2: Work SC into each stitch across the row. Then, CH 1 and turn. This row will also have 111 stitches.
- Row 3: Work SC into each of the first 2 stitches. Then, TC into the next stitch, followed by SC into the next stitch. Repeat from \* across the row until 2 stitches remain. Work 1 SC into each of the last 2 stitches. Finally, CH 1 and turn.
  - Tip: A helpful tip for Row 3 is to mark the first TC of Row 3 with a stitch marker.
     As the blanket grows, you should move the stitch marker up to the next TC on the row where you start with 2 SC. This serves as a reminder of which row begins with 2 SC.
- Row 4: Repeat the instructions for Row 2.
- Row 5: Work SC into the first stitch of the row. Then, TC into the next stitch, followed by SC into the next stitch. Repeat from \* across the row. Finally, CH 1 and turn.
- Row 6: Repeat the instructions for Row 2.
- Continuing the Pattern: Continue by repeating rows 3 through 6 until the blanket measures square. The pattern specifies to end on a Row 2 instruction (which means ending on a row of SC).

#### **Blanket Border Instructions**

Once the main blanket body is complete, the border adds a refined finish.

- First Round (SC Border): After finishing the last row of SC, do not turn.
  - Work 2 more SC into the last stitch.
  - o Work 1 SC per the end of each row down the first side of the blanket.
  - Work 3 SC into the corner.
  - Work 1 SC into each stitch on the bottom of the blanket.
  - Work 3 SC into the next corner.
  - Work 1 SC per the end of each row on the final side.
  - Finish this round by working 2 SC into the last corner, then SL ST to the first stitch.

#### HDC Ribbed Border:

- o After the first round of SC, **do not turn**.
- o Chain 8.
- Work 1 HDC into each of the next 7 chains.
- o Then, SL ST into the next 2 stitches on the edge of the blanket.
- Turn the blanket edge away from you.
- Work 1 back loop HDC into each of the 7 HDC.
- Chain 1 and turn.
- Work 1 HDC into each back loop of the next 7 HDC.
- Repeat from \* until you reach a corner.

# • Rounding the Corners (HDC Ribbed Border):

- o To round a corner, first **SL ST into the next stitch only once**.
- Then, work the ribbing.
- Next, SL ST once into the middle stitch.
- Work the ribbing again.
- SL ST into the same middle stitch again.
- Work the ribbing.

- SL ST a final time into the middle stitch.
- Work the ribbing, then SL ST 1 time into the next stitch.
- Work the ribbing, then resume SL ST into each of the next 2 stitches.
- **Completing the Ribbed Border:** Continue this ribbing technique around the entire edge of the blanket. When you return to the starting corner, **finish working around that corner**.

## Finishing the Blanket

After the border is complete, the final steps ensure a neat and tidy finish.

• **Tie Off and Sew:** Once you've worked around the entire border and returned to the starting corner, **tie off** your yarn. Then, **sew the bottom edge of the starting chain to the last row of ribbing** to secure it.

Weave in Ends: Finally, tie off and weave in all remaining ends for a clean appearance.
